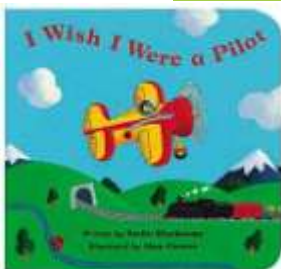
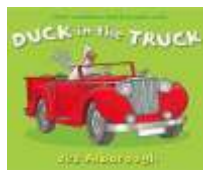


## "Transport"

Our topic for the first part of term will be "Transport". All children will have the opportunity to engage in adult-led and child initiated activities, including discussions, free play, story time, indoor and outdoor activities. We will talk about different transportation vehicles and encourage the children to expand their world views and curiosity about the world around them.

To broaden our vocabulary we will use words that relate to our theme such as space shuttle, tram, steam train, tractor, boat, aeroplane, helicopter, passenger, carrying, moving etc.

During the term, we will be reading books to the children that are centred around our topic (please see some examples below). Reading is vital for language development. To encourage a love for books and to further support learning, we welcome parents to read books daily at home with their child(ren).
